Johnson City is firmly established as a regional medical center. Following is a list of hospitals in the Johnson City region.

Johnson City Medical Center - 443-bed private, not-for-profit acute-care hospital serving Northeast Tennessee and surrounding states. JCMC is also a teaching hospital affiliated with the ETSU James H. Quillen College of Medicine. As a progressive medical center, it boasts state designation as a Regional Perinatal Center and a Level I Trauma Center for emergency medical care. The hospital also operates the regions' first and only dedicated medical air transport service - Wings Air Rescue.

JCMC offers a full range of specialty care services through The Center for Advanced Surgery, The Center for Cardiovascular Health, The Center for Pulmonary Medicine, The Children's Hospital, the Center for Women's Health, and the Regional Cancer Center. Johnson City medical Center also runs the Wellness Center in two locations in Johnson City and the health Resources Center at The Mall at Johnson City.

JCMC has several programs designed to meet the needs of business and industry. Health Advantage is a comprehensive occupational medicine program, which was developed by asking businesses what they really need and want from a healthcare provider. Occupational medical services are available at Medical Center North, 1019 W. Oakland Avenue in Johnson City. Health Advantage offers a wide array of services, including initial diagnosis and treatment of injuries/illnesses, X-rays and CT scanning, drug testing, physical examinations and more.

RehabPlus, an outpatient rehabilitation service targeted at industry, offers structured, goal-oriented and individualized programs to optimize the ability of the employee to return to work. RehabPlus has three locations in Johnson City: 1725 W. Market Street, 2410 Susannah Street and #3 Professional Park Drive, Suite 10.

Johnson City Specialty Hospital - 49-bed acute care hospital combines a warm family atmosphere with state-of-the-art equipment to provide special care for patients. Specialties at JCSH include obstetrics and gynecology, ophthalmology, otorhinolaryngology, diabetes treatment, general and plastic surgery, and diagnostic breast care. The hospital, while not offering Emergency Department services at this time, provides other services as well on an inpatient and outpatient basis.

James H. & Cecile C. Quillen Rehabilitation Hospital - 60-bed facility and is the region's first and most comprehensive inpatient rehabilitation hospital. The hospital is accredited by the Rehabilitation Accreditation Commission (CARF) and The Joint Commission Accreditation of Hospital Organization. The staff is well trained and able to help patients with the following problems but not limited to: brain injury, stroke, amputation, spinal cord injury, burns, orthopedic injury, rheumatologic impairments, neurological and neuromuscular problems, and major multiple trauma. They also have inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services.

Niswonger Children's Hospital opened in 2009 and is the only facility between Knoxville and Roanoke that is a member of the National Association of Children's Hospitals and Related Institutions (NACHRI) currently serving more than 200,000 children in a four-state-29-county region. Niswonger Children's Hospital works in partnership with the ETSU College of Medicine and has more than 20 pediatric subspecialties and 127 physicians on staff. It is one of six national affiliates of the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. The hospital has 69 rooms and is staffed by people who are dedicated to providing the highest quality health care available for your child. It offers critical care services through **The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)** and **Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)** with specially trained, registered nurses caring for newborns. Trained staff to help children to understand what is happening to them and why medical procedures are important, even when they hurt. Mom and Dad are with them and can stay at the **Ronald McDonald House** when they have to travel a long distance for their children's treatment and need lodging. Transport services are available 24 hours a day, providing special care for the unique needs of children. **Wings Air Rescue**, is the region's only dedicated medical air transport service, with care provided by a team of highly skilled personnel from either the NICU or the PICU. The Pediatric and Newborn transport ambulance, also staffed with NICU or PICU professionals, is a state-of-the-art mobile intensive care unit.

North Side Hospital - 119-bed general acute care hospital providing a full range of acute care and skilled nursing services on an inpatient basis, a complementary set of outpatient services, and a 24-hour emergency department. MedWorks, the only 24-hour occupational medicine program in NE TN, is available at NSH.

Woodridge Psychiatric Hospital - 75-bed inpatient provider of mental health and chemical dependency services for children, adolescent, and adults from age 6 on up. The Psychiatrist leads a team of professionals that include Clinicians, Social Workers, Recreational Therapists, and Psychiatric Nurses.

The James H. Quillen Veterans Affairs Medical Center is a comprehensive healthcare facility serving more than 22,000 veterans in a four-state service area. The VA is located on 207 beautifully landscaped acres and shares the West End of the campus with the East Tennessee State University College of Medicine.

The VAMC is a teaching hospital and has affiliations with the James H. Quillen College of Medicine as well as numerous other institutions of higher learning for various internships.

The VAMC has 111 – hospital beds, 295 – Domiciliary beds, which offers a variety of treatment options including a Homeless inpatient treatment program and Homeless Outreach and 120 – Nursing Home Care unit beds

A U. S. National Cemetery is also located on the grounds of the VAMC.
